The Council of State Governments has called upon the fifty states to pass a resolution calling for a "Conference of States," to be held in October 1995, to be attended by a minimum of 350 delegates, to include 50 State Governors, and 300 state legislators, 6 for each state, as appointed by the Governors, to "develop a comprehensive action plan to restore balance in the federal system." The Council of State Governors and Legislatures of each state with an identical resolution which,

if passed, empowers the delegates to act in behalf of their state. Governor Benjamin Nelson of Nebraska (D) and Governor Michael Leavitt of Ulah (R) are the official spokesmen for the Council of State Governments, for the promotion of what is now known as 'The Conference of the States' (COS). A preliminary meeting of the delegates is scheduled in Chicago during July to set the agenda and the procedures for the second, which is scheduled to be held in Philadelphia the 22nd through the 25th of October, the 50th anniversary of the founding of the United Nations.

COS has been dubbed 'Philadel-

phia II<sup>\*</sup>. It is a historic first formal gathering of the states since 1787, It enjoys broad, bipartisan support from state leaders. It is guided by a na-tional, bipartisan steering committee of state elected officials, under the auspices of The Council of State Governments in cooperation with the auspices of The Council of State Governments in cooperation with the National Governor's Association, the National Council of State Legisla-tures, and the Legislative Exchange Council.

# History

At least two of these organizations, may be all of them, are branches of the old Public Administration Clearinghouse (PAC) formally located at 1313 60th Street, Chicago, Illinois. You are not supposed to know that PAC is the true origin of the term 'PAC', an organization of persons or coganizations for the purpose of introducing or promoting the passage of legislation for their mutual benefit or profit.

Correction: PAC was errone-ously printed in issue #1 of Veritas as PAG. Please make this correction to your records and to your copy of issue #1. Please accept our sincere apology.

PAC was founded by the Rockefeller and Carnegie Foundations in 1930. Funding came from grants furnished by these same foundations. PAC is the organization that drafted the Presidential Proclamations of Funklin D. Roosevelt beginned for the control of Funklin D. Roosevelt beginned for the casting and the control of the casting national emergency in banking, and for other purposes. All of which gave President Roosevelt dictatorial powers. H.R. 1491, as amended, gave blanket congressional approval to all Executive Orders issued by any President past, present, or future. This blanket approval effectively converted the office of the President to the office of the Fresident to the office of the King. PAC has

evolved over the years into the Advisory Commission on Intergovernmental Relations (ACIR), the Council of State Governments (CSG), and the Committee on the Constitutional System (CCS). CCS is an organization which promotes the adoption of the parliamentary system of government by the United States and the several States. Do not let the word several States. Do not let the word state Governments is an international organization with an international membership.

PAC, ACIR, and CSG have been the source of most of the legislation introduced and passed in the United States House and Senate, and both houses of all 50 State Legislatures since 1930. # Citizens of the American Republic

For some time now, we who oppose the Conference of the States (COS) have done so on the basis that this COS is no ordinary national conference. Rather, we believe it is a precursor to a Constitutional Comention (Con-Con). We further believe a Con-Con at this time of dramatic change in our country is ill-advised and would effectively destroy many constitutional principles we find virtually sacred.

The proponents of the COS have steadfastly insisted a Con-Con is not their intention. However, there are many warning signals that would indicest the control of the states state resolutions being requested of the states specify that the bylaws of the COS will be "confined" to "fundamental, structural, long-term reforms" in governance. We do not believe it is possible to explore these ideas without coming dangerously close to a Con-Con.

In addition, Article 1, Section 10 of our United States Constitution states, "No State shall, without the consent of Congress . . . enter into any Agreement or Compact with another State ... "From this, it is clear the COS and the State's Petition, which is the stated goal of the COS, do represent an agreement or compact with other states, and as such are in direct violation of the Constitution barring consent of Congress.

On March 2, 1995, Senator Hank Brown introduced SR 82 in the U.S. Congress. This resolution laments Congress inability to pass the Balanced Budget Amendment and, then, as the enacting clause of the Resolution, states, "Resolved, that Congress hereby petitions the several States of the United States to America to convene a Conference of the States for the express and exclusive purpose of drafting an Amendment to the United States continuition of the United States of America to convene a Constitutional Convention pursuant to Article V of the Constitution of the United States of America to convene a Constitution of condens or order to a

such Amendment."

This resolution is believed to clearly represent the "consent of Congress" as required by Article 1, Section 10 of the Constitution. This consent document goes one step further, however, and lays the groundwork for a Con-

as required by Article 1, Section 10 of the Constitution. This consent document goes one step further, however, and lays the groundwork for a Con-Con.

The supporters of the COS can no longer say the intent of the COS is not to conven a Con-Con. We now have in plain language, for all to see, the preparatory steps to a Con-Con. Our worst fears for the dangers this COS represents to our Constitution are now real. The constitutional crisis represented by this COS must be opposed by all who rever the work of the Framers of our Constitution.

A Constitutional Convention at this point in our nation's history is not recommended because statesman of the caliber of Thomas Jefferson, John Adams, and Benjamia Franklin are not presently in national political lead-ership. Our nation has such people; each of us must seek them out and then provide the support to encourage these people to show themselves.

# **Omnibus Counter**terrorism Bill

New FBI Charter to Investigate **Political Groups**

On February 10, 1995 the Omnibus Counterterrorism Bill was introduced as S. 390 in the Senate and as H.R. 896 in the House. Initiated by the FBI, and passed on by the Justice Department and the White House. Senators Bilden (D-BB) and Specter (R-PA) initiated it in the Senate, Reps. Schutter (B-NY) and Disks (D-WA) in the House. This bill may move quickly due to

(D-NV) and Dicks (D-WA) in the House. This bill may move quickly due to bipartisan support.

This bill will allow the FBI, military and other agencies to perform investigations on political groups at will. It will authorize secret trials for immigrants without being charged for a crime but rather who are accused of supporting lawful activity by organizations which may be accused of committing tillegal acts. Immigrants can be deported using evidence they or their attorneys would never see, in secret trials, and with one sided appeals. The definition of terrorism will be broadened. The President's determination of who is a terrorist will not be appealable.

Posse Comitatus will be suspended - allowing the use of the military to aid the police regardless of any other laws.

Rules regarding wiretaps will be loosened.

Accused will be ineligible for bail.

If this bill is allowed to pass, the government may target organizations solely on their political beliefs. In closing, international terrorism does not include anything that is not already a crime.

"Since the new offense does not cover anything that is not already a crime, the main purpose of the proposal seems to be to avoid certain constitutional and statutory protections that would otherwise apply." - Center for National Security Studies

# Conference of the States:

"I have seen the future, and in it I have seen the end of our republic, and it is scheduled for October 1995 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania."

"The Scenario"

It is the summer of 1995

It is the summer of 1995.

For decades now, the U.S. Congress has continued to operate far beyond the enumerated powers defined for it in Article 1, Section 8 of the United States Constitution. Years and years of unconstitutional and unded amadates have brought the states to a boiling point. The Tenth Amendment Initiative started in 1994 by Senator Charles Duke of Coloniod did ripple across the country, but to no avail. There seems to be no relief from the constant pressure of federal oppression. Following the lead of Governor Mike Leavitiof Utah and the Council of State Governments, over twenty-six of the states have passed resolutions calling for a "Conference of the States." The delegations from all fifty states arrive and the Conference Chairman, Governor Leavitt of Utah, calls the conference to order and places the by-laws and other administrative rules into effect. There are several spirited discussions about states' rights and federal mandates.

#### DAY TWO

Begins with more heated debates. Frustration leads to questionable action at first, as the debate turns to drafting new amendments to the Constitution and then the rules are suspended by a vote that passes by a narrow majority. Someone moves to petition the U.S. Congress to convene a Constitutional Convention and offers a candidate petition right then and there! Several members of the delegations try to object but are then and there! Several members of the delegations try to object but are nuled out of order (the rules are suspended, remember). The petition passes and is immediately transmitted to the United States Congress. Congress responds to the petition and under the authority of Article V of the Constitution declares the Conference of the States to be a Constitutional Convention and Simultaneously declares the Conference of the States to be CONCURRENTLY, a Ratifying Convention under the same Article V (" . . . when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states, OR BY CONVENTIONS . . ") Congress returns authorization to Philadelphia within hours.

#### DAY THREE

DAY THREE

The Supreme Court refuses to bear a brief quickly prepared to stop the runaway convention stating that the issues are "political" in nature and beyond the purview of the Court. (The Court relies on Coleman vs. Miller, 307 U.S. 433 (1939)) The Conference of the States, essentially a CON-CON, a Constitutional Convention, now in full stride, continues to propose "fundamental, structural and long term" changes (words taken directly from the resolutions passed in the states months before) to our federal government (SR 12 in Pennsylvania; SCR 618, HCR 1401, or HCR 781 in Florida; SCR 32 in Michigan as examples.)

Legislators home in their various states are following events at the conference. They are confused as to how this apparent reversal of events could have happened. They had beeded the voices of concern and had amended their respective state resolutions with words they thought would protect against just such events as this from happening. Words that had been provided to them by the Council of State Government site!! If only they had understood that by empowering their delegations to act on behalf of "We the People", they had allowed to be created a sovereign body outside the Constitution. And that body was now empowered to create or destroy government itself. They had allowed to be created as overeign body outside the Constitution, and they had lost. IF ONLY THEY HAD ANO PPORTUNITYTO CASTTHAT SEEMINGLY NISIGNIFICANT VOTE OVER AGAIN.

The debates back at the Conference of the States continue into the night as amendments are offered, debated, and ratified in a matter of hours. Years and years of frustration are vented while over two hundred years of our constitutional republic lies helpless on the surgeon's table. It is the end of DAY THREE. Cotober Z4, 1995, And while our nation contemplates the future of our republic, much of the rest of the world celebrates the filtieth Anniversary of the United Nations.




